The MDS 3.0 assessment process and data base created a new focus for long term care providers, regulators and federal payment systems. All professionals involved in the operational, clinical and financial management of care delivery and facility process need to understand the content of the database, the definitions that create and identify the issues and its outcomes in the federal and state databases.
